KISS AND RIDE-Help Keep Our Students Safe!

Please help us keep your children safe by following our Kiss & Ride procedures. Due to the continuous flow of cars in the front of the school and the dangers this poses to students crossing or coming into the building late, the entrance is blocked to cars at the front during morning arrival and after school departure times. Cars that park in the emergency route compromise the safety of the students should there be a need for emergency vehicles to access the school in a timely manner. Cars will not have access to the front door during these times and parents are asked to use the Kiss and Ride loop even when children are late. Parents are reminded that all adults must report to the office when entering the building for safety reasons. We thank you for your understanding. The Kiss n Ride entry is **ONE WAY** so once you enter to park your car, you must drive one way to exit. Also, please remember not to ever cross the driveways in the Kiss n Ride loop. Park and walk your child(ren) into the school yard using sidewalks and walkways.

SCHOOL SAFETY

The doors to the school are locked throughout the day and this includes the front door that now has a buzzer. Please ring the buzzer if you wish to enter and the office staff will let you in if they recognize you. The Before and After Program will now have parents entering from the Kindergarten doors so they can ensure that adults entering the building are recognized. This means that Door C and the front door will be locked before and after school.

Thanksgiving Food Drive:

This year's Thanksgiving Food Drive is called "One for Haiti, One for Mercy." All schools across the York Catholic District School Board are participating in this worthy cause and together, all school communities are asking each student to bring **one** food item to school before and after Thanksgiving. If all students across our system provide one item, we will be able to send over 55,000 food items to Haiti! The goal is to fill a 40 foot long container with food items such as rice, pasta, dried beans, chickpeas, chicken broth, canned meats, oils, cornmeal and canned fish. We thank you for your generosity and support.



VISITING THE SCHOOL

At Guardian Angels CES, our primary concern is the safety of all the children. School staff must know the identity of all visitors and the purpose of their visit. For this reason, all visitors, including parents and grandparents are requested to use the buzzer system upon entering the school. Please remember that you are a stranger to other staff and students. Please use the main doors and report to the office upon entering the school. We also ask that when entering, you do not let others in behind you.

All visitors must be buzzed in. All parents and visitors are asked to sign in and out of the office when entering the school. Whether you are meeting a teacher, picking up your child or volunteering, you must enter through the front doors of the school and check in at the office. Adults walking in the hall-way without a sash or sticker will be redirected to the office. Thank you in advance for your co-operation with these important safety procedures.

HEAD LICE

The York Catholic District School Board recognizes and appreciates concerns related to pediculosis at the school, community, and regional level. The Board also recognizes that the Ministry of Health does not designate pediculosis as a communicable disease, and as such, it is not considered a health hazard to the community." (Policy 210)

Anyone can get head lice, regardless of cleanliness. Head lice are not a public hazard, as they do not cause illness, but they are a nuisance. To prevent this from becoming a problem at Guardian Angels CES we all need to work together. Please check your child's head weekly for lice or nits. If you do find lice or nits, contact the office so that we can notify other parents in the class to keep a special watch for any signs of head lice.

Readmission to school is contingent upon lice no longer being present and all the (nits) eggs have been removed. Parents must complete a "return to school" form once treatment has been completed. YCDSB ASTHMA POLICY

In accordance with the *Act to Protect Pupils with Asthma* (Ryan's Law: Ensuring Asthma Friendly Schools, 2015) the Board approved a new policy # 206: Protection of Students with *Asthma* at its June 21st Board Meeting. The York Catholic District School Board recognizes that there are some students within the school system who have a diagnosis of asthma which could be life threatening. The York Catholic District School Board also recognizes that asthma management is a shared responsibility among students, parents, caregivers and the entire school community.

It is the responsibility of parent(s)/guardian(s) to advise the school immediately upon registration and/or when in receipt of a diagnosis of asthma. It is also the responsibility of parent(s)/guardian(s) to ensure that all medical information pertinent to their child's diagnosis of asthma is al-ways current. If your child has a diagnosis of asthma please contact the school office immediately so that the appropriate forms are completed and school records are up to date in accordance with Policy 206.

On Monday, October 16th, all of our students will be participating in how to safely board and exit a bus in an emergency situation as well as reviewing the safety rules and expectations while on the bus.


LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT PRAYER

York Catholic District School Board Land Acknowledgment

School Boards across Ontario are demonstrating their commitment to Truth and Reconciliation by providing Land Acknowledgements that honour Indigenous Peoples and traditional lands. At the York Catholic District School Board (YCDSB), we echo the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops (CCCB) and the Assembly of Catholic Bishops of Ontario (ACBO) in their response to the Calls to Action through the Truth and Reconciliation Commission.

It is in this response that YCDSB acknowledges that for thousands of years, Indigenous Peoples have lived on this land. Acknowledging the territory where we gather and the people who have traditionally called this land home is one of the ways the YCDSB is participating in the actions necessary for Truth and Reconciliation.

YCDSB's First Nations, Métis and Inuit Steering Committee (Indigenous Elders and YCDSB Board and school staff) developed a Land Acknowledgement Statement. This statement is inclusive of all Indigenous Peoples. It honours those who have walked this land, in the past, present, and those who will walk it in the future. It is a respectful validation of the recommendations of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission.

The YCDSB Land Acknowledgement will be embedded as a distinct school practice and will be recited at all large school community gatherings.

It reads:

We are gathered on the ancestral lands and waters of all Indigenous Peoples, who have left their footprints on Mother Earth before us.

We respectfully acknowledge those who have walked on it, those who walk on it now, and future generations who have yet to walk upon it.

We pray to the Creator for strength and wisdom that all may continue to serve as stewards of the Earth.
