The Staff at Guardian Angels committed fully to provide engaging learning opportunities for our students. Take a look at all of the wonderful learning that has took place on our virtual platforms:

KINDERGARTEN: The FDK students participated in weekly Google Meets which included, Show & Share, Mother's Day Tea, A Scavenger Hunt, Number BINGO, Sight Word BINGO, Directed Drawing, Father's Day Virtual Barbecue and Kahoots.

GRADE 1: This crew was busy with : Interactive Google Slides, Padlet Photo Sharing, Jamboard Math Talks, Interactive Board Games, Choice Boards, Guided Drawing, Fun Friday Google Meets (BINGO, What Time is it Mr. Wolf, Sharing Circles), Virtual Zoo Field Trip, Digital Class Yearbook

GRADE 2: The engagement continues through the Primary Division with: Daily Virtual Community Circle Tasks, Jamboard Math Talks, Interactive Google Slides. Dailv Video Lessons. Daily Virtual Announcements, Guided Drawing, Book Talks, Weekly Meditation, Fun Friday Google Meets (Sharing Circles, BINGO, Praying the Rosary, Math Games), Author Visit, Scavenger Hunts, Virtual Class Field Trips to the Toronto Zoo and Ripley's Aquarium, Virtual Math Manipulatives Sites, Daily Language & Math Games & Learning Opportunities on Epic Books, Raz Kids, IXL, Lalilo

GRADE 3: Our Grade 3 students were occupied with outreach and big ideas: delivering Letters to Healthcare workers at St. Joseph Hospital; celebrating Earth Day, participating inEducation Week activities to Ignite Hope within our local community, practising Mindfulness; hosting wonderful community guests! (*Guests Included:* Laurie Thompson author of Emmanuel's Dream, Andrea from @gatewayyoga,

Angela Hanimyan author of "Fearless Felicia", Scientist Amanda, CBC Studio K Host, Tony)

They delved into United Nations Sustainable Development Goals, Our Global Classroom, Good Health & Well Being, Student Voice and Hope Movement; a virtual bitmoji classroom to share student presentations using video, flipgrid and shadow puppet ed... They co-constructed and shared a google slide for class poetry party, had a padlet showcase of mother mary prayers, mandala art, problem solving build/creations! But wait there's more...

GRADE 4: Our Grade 4 students participated in: Dear God Gratitude Journal, Hour of Code Monday, Whiteboard Wednesday, Book Talks, Author Visit, Gateway Yoga, Joy for All Project, Celebration of Learning, Father's Day Salute, Joke of The Day & Brainteaser, Victoria Day Class Fun Facts Poster and FIREWORKS Art, Scavenger Hunt, Google Meet Hope Where Are You? Stories of children all over the world during COVID; Digital Escape Rooms, FUN Friday Google meets (themed Fridays, Beach day/Special memory photo day, Poetry Cafe) and the Paper Airplane Challenge!

GRADE 5: Our Grade 5 students were positively consistent in their attendance and participation in Daily Google Meets, sharing Daily Virtual Announcements and messages of positivity. They explored multiple learning opportunities on Epic and IXL, createdInteractive Google Slides & Jam Boards, hosted a Live Scavenger Hunt, Genius Hour and Minute to Win it!

GRADE 6: The Grade 6 people engaged in daily Google Meets too,to talk and discuss their daily learning goals and consolidate their newly acquired concepts. Hope Boxes were a hit, as students gathered simple items around their homes that reminded them that there is hope all. Poetry Slides showcased the hidden poets inside of everyone, Students created virtual collages to represent monthly character virtues, using Pic Collage and Google Draw. Grade 6s prepared Virtual Family Trees, through which they shared family history as immigrants to Canada and created symbols to represent their identity as Canadians. Amazing!

GRADE 7 & 8: We can count on our Intermediate Division to round out the rich learning. This month, our intermediate students continued to showcase their

creativity through poetry. Despite the unknown and the distance between them, they were connected once again through their shared thoughts, feelings and experiences by creating a digital Poetry Anthology. Our students took on the role of photojournalists as they captured the special moments that have emerged from this unprecedented time. We are so proud of our intermediate students for their dedication and hard work!

CORE RESOURCE: Core students also interacted with their own VLEs, which included literacy and numeracy practice, fun activities and daily living tasks that could be practiced at home. Students participated in live Google Meets with EAs to hear stories, practice skills, play some games and interact with classmates and peers.

FRENCH: En français, students shared videos and pictures of their work and of themselves practising poems, singing songs while using vocabulary and lessons that they have been learning. They have enjoyed posting on the shared class padlet as well as sharing with their teachers. Junior FSL students have attended Google Meets, created posters of what Hope means to them, listened to music and played games to reinforce vocabulary and lessons. They even created a superhero to help fight/cure Covid-19, illustrating and describing their superhero en français! Bravo, les élèves!

MUSIC: With Catholic Education Week as the inspiration, students in Grades 3/4 to Grade 8 learned the Theme song "HOPE" by Christopher Rait. Students responded to the song in a variety of ways. Some students video recorded themselves, complete with artwork and choreography (!) while singing the song and /or accompanying themselves on various instruments, like guitar, piano, recorder, ukulele, or they otherwise created or improvised with body percussion, drums, or Garage Band! Using symbols of Hope, students also created pictures and posters which they could share with the world by posting them in their windows. Uplifting!

HEALTH / FAMILY LIFE: With establishing EASY Health Habits as the end goal, students participated in a health scavenger hunt and explored how to manage their heightened emotions by taking a brain break. Remember E- eat fruits and vegetables; A- active for an hour or more daily; S- screens - limit that screen

time; Y- yes - say yes to water and no to sugary drinks. A healthy body works for you! Continue to work on those EASY Healthy Habits!

LIBRARY- The Virtual Library gave all the students an opportunity to enjoy a variety of books, including the Virtue books. Google Meets allowed Mrs. Fazari to read aloud to the students & have meaningful discussions.

DAILY PRAYERS & MORNING ANNOUNCEMENTS:

Although not nearly as fun as the Kiss n' Ride or touring the yard, Mrs. Pocrnic delighted in "greeting" the students each morning, as your child's teacher continued to post a video of O Canada, prayers, and morning announcements to their Virtual Learning environments (VLEs). We hope that this source of information and daily prayer with your child proved useful!

Our Welcome to Kindergarten Site was created to share information with our new families regarding the FDK program at GNA. Through Google Meets, the Kindergarten Staff had the opportunity to meet our new Kindergarten students via Google Meets. It was a pleasure meeting all of them virtually and we are looking forward to having them begin their educational journey at GNA.

REGISTRATION IS OPEN: We continue to welcome new students for the 2020-21 school year. Student registrations will take place online throughout the summer, as a result of the Ontario public school closures due to COVID-19. The YCDSB Admissions Department is accepting online registrations for Kindergarten to Grade 12 students during the summer at <u>www.ycdsb.ca/admissions/</u>. The deadline to register a student is August 17, 2020. Students and families seeking to register past this cut-off date can register and will have to wait until early September, after the school year has started, to be assigned to a class. This deadline is necessary to help facilitate a safe and predictable school year start-up as per the Ministry of Education.

ARE YOU MOVING?: Will you be leaving the GNA community at the end of this school year? If so, please let us know so that we can adjust classes and staff accurately for the 2020-2021 school year.
